Due to the nature of school this year, each student's most valuable school supply will be their Chromebook! It is exceedingly important that they have a fully charged Chromebook, charging cord, and headphones/earbuds with them *each day*. Some classes will have charging capabilities but most will not, that means that each student will need a charged computer and their charging cord every day that they CANNOT share with other students.
