# **Middle School Summer Reading**

The importance of summer reading has been demonstrated repeatedly in a variety of research studies. Over and over again, it has been shown that students who read during the summer do much better in school when it starts again in the fall. On the other hand, students who do not read during the summer demonstrate significant loss. Middle School is an important time to continue the process of being a dedicated reader.

# Summer Reading Assignment: Choose one option below

# Newspaper (Word Gifted)

Create a Newspaper with at least 5 articles about your book. You can choose to write an informational article on the setting, an advertisement for the adventure, an editorial or opinion piece, etc. Your layout should be similar to a newspaper.

## Map-It

(Visual-Spatial Gifted)
Create a map showing the setting (or route) taken by the main character in your book during his/her adventure. The map can be of a physical journey they take or an emotional one. Identify and describe at least 5 events from the book and place the description on the map in

the appropriate place.

# <u>Mural</u>

(Art Gifted)

Create a mural depicting important parts of your book. Use a large sheet of paper for your mural and be sure to cover the paper (mural style). You will need to include a written description (at least 6 sentences) describing your mural.

### Interview

(People Gifted)

Determine a moral or ethical issue your main character was faced with. Determine 5 questions you could ask to find out what family and friends might have done in the situation. Interview 3 people using the 5 questions you created. Hand in the answers and a 5 sentence summary of your findings.



## Mobile

(Kinesthetic Gifted)

Create a mobile (using at least 5 cards and a hanger) depicting major events in your story. On one side of the card, describe what happened during the major event and on the other side create a picture showing the event. Be sure the events you choose represent the Exposition, Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action, and Resolution.

### Plot Poem

(Music Gifted)

Create 5 poems, at least three (3) should represent different styles of poetry. Each poem should describe a different literary element from your book:
Characterization, Setting, Conflict/Resolution. Be sure to include and underline at least 3 different types of figurative language.

## **Author Research**

(Logical/Mathematical Gifted)
Investigate how the author came up with the idea for the story. What research did he or she have to do to write the book? Take your research and create a visual display to share your findings. This can be in the form of a poster, powerpoint, etc. Or you can write a script and video tape yourself as the author!

# Scrapbook (Self Gifted)

Create a Scrapbook with the following pages:

- Title and Author
- Characters
- Setting
- Conflict
- Resolution
- Plot
- Critique

Use words and pictures to describe these literary elements on the appropriate page of the scrap book.
